

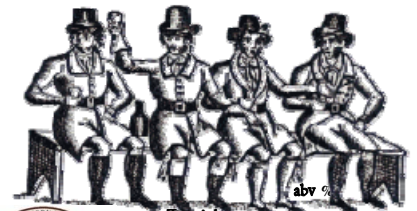


BEER FOR SLAKING A THIRST

Craft breweries who need your support



- Chiltern Ale** - 1038 og "Excellent quaffing ale - light and refreshing." Brewed in Buckinghamshire by gentlemen of the Chiltern Brewery
- Beechwood Bitter** - Mild amber colour with a rich butter-toffee aroma. Fruity and slightly nutty. A camra gold medallist from the Chiltern Brewery
- Brakspear Bitter** - It has a malty, bitter taste to start with a bittersweet fruity finish. English Goldings and Fuggles Hops
- Knight of the Garter** - A light "Golden Beer" with a distinctly Citrus fruit hop aroma achieved with Amarillo aroma hops.
- Rebellion I.P.A.** - Marlow Brewery A drinkable session ale, dry hoppy with a burnt orange sweet background, tastes like a cricket match on a lazy afternoon.
- Marlow Mild** - Less hopped than bitter, a dark style making a come back, fruity sweetish finish - The working man's drink and in-the-know toffs. From the Rebellion Brewery, Buckinghamshire.
- Old Peculier Theakstons Brewery** - A dark, strong beer Old Peculier is justifiably famous for its rich and complete character, its sheer strength, rich, full-bodied, malty, fuggle hops – and for being a beer with a long history.
- IPA 69 - Lovibonds Brewery** - Deep amber colour, citrusy sweet hoppy flavour with a bitter finish. Fuses the great history of the traditional British IPA with modern hops and techniques from America.

Specialist Lagers, Wheat Beers and Trappist Ales

- Cotswold Premium Lager** - Craft made & natural - best of all its unpasteurised. Lager brewing practices are inspired by the German purity law of 1516, which means that our beers are preservative free and cold stored for at least 4 weeks
- Cotswold Wheat Beer** - Craft made & natural wheat beer easy drinking -good -even for breakfast mouth
- Cotswold 3,8 Light Lager** - Craft made & natural - Lighter in the Continental style, more flavour than the usual suspects
- Henley Gold - Lovibonds Brewery** - made from yeast from the oldest brewery in the World. Wheat beer and easily drunk.
- Becks Vier** - Made to German purity laws, lighter to drink than classic Becks. Made in Germany
- Fruli Strawberry** - Unfiltered wheat beer, this light, creamy fresh beer combines lemony fruitiness with gorgeous strawberry flavours and even a hint of mint. Easy to drink and very popular.
- Kostritzer Schwarzbier Black Lager** - oldest family owned brewery in Germany, made same way since 16th century.
- Leffe** - Abbey Ale that develops a depth from longer maturity. Smooth and malty.
- Budweiser Budvar** - The best and real thing - a light, smooth and malty golden lager made in Bohemia
- Chimay Triple White** - This top fermented Trappist beer is not pasteurised. Golden colour and slightly hazy appearance.

Ciders and Perry

- Westons Perry** - Made from pears. Clear and bright
- Orchard Pig Cider 4.2** - This has matured for at least 6 months - a delicious, refreshing drink. Very full, flavoursome, with distinct apple flavours.
- Cotswold Cider** - The Cider has all the taste of the apples from which it was created, with a slight sparkle and a real scrumpy haze.

- Tripel Karmeliet** - Blond wheat, barley and oats, spicy, with hints of vanilla, cloves, cinnamon and coriander, sweet finish.
- Orval** - Orange and hoppy with an extremely dry finish. Dry hopped. **An authentic Abbey Trappist beer** . The nose is yeasty, acidic, hoppy and fruity in a citrus sense. A Truly unique beer. One of the most bitter beers - love it or hate it.
- Trappiste Rochefort 10** - Dark authentic **Trappist beer** . An immense, complex nose. Strong abbey ale.
- Chimay Blue Trappist beer** - the monks treat their beer as wine. Bottle fermented and tastes like zinfandel grape
- Delirium Tremens Blonde** - Liquid bread, the beer has yeast and fruit in the nose, but a surprisingly dry flavour, with a more subdued fruit content
- Marston's Owd Roger Strong Country Ale** - an "own Brew" served here for over 100 years- wish it was on tap.
- Fraoch Heather Ale** - Pronounced "Frook". The oldest style of beer in the world. a taste of the ancient Picts brew. Slainte
- Innis & Gunn** - Oak aged in bourbon casks - smooth, sweet, pale and caramels - yum the noo - not bitter
- Gordon's Scotch Highland Ale** - A Belgian golden tribute of old Victorian Scotch ale when we ruled the waves.
- Duvel** - A blond golden ale with a frothy white head, heavily hopped yet fruity. Duvel is the most popular beer sold in Belgium
- Worthington White Shield** - **This is a taste of our past brewing Empire.** Bottle conditioned pale ale, delicate yeasty, hoppy, malt flavour with living yeast in the bottom - 2006 Bottle Conditioned Champion
- Traquair House Ale** - Oldest inhabited house Laird's ale - his craft brewery, dark ale sweet finish
- Deus - Brut des Flanders Champagne Beer** - Twice fermented, brewed and riddled, 750ml wine sized bottle
- Bacchus Krick** - Cherry beer based on a classic brown ale - has an excellent fruit aroma and a balancing tannic dryness.
- Bacchus Frambozen** - Raspberry fruit beer, sweeter than the cherry, refreshing all year round.
- Aecht Schlenkerla Rauchbier** - Since 1678 - the barley malt is smoked over beech wood, gives a smokey flavour
- Bodgers Barley Wine** - 18th century patriotic answer to French wine to piss Napoleon off -unique in being like a very sturdy India Pale Ale , but with 'hop wine' overtones
